What is SASE?


Founded in November 2007, the Society of Asian Scientists and Engineers (SASE) is a nationally recognized 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with 20,000 members worldwide. It has since been a locomotive in helping scientific and engineering professionals achieve their full potential. In 2015, a chapter was established at the University of South Florida (USF) with only 5 determined women with the need to represent and help their community in the field of science and engineering. Our chapter has grown exceptionally, gaining 700+ members since the chapter was founded, with achievements in providing our members with professional opportunities, academic success, and enriching cultural education to advance diversity on campus.

OUR MISSION

SASE is the Society of Asian Scientists & Engineers, and our mission is to create a welcoming community where members can help each other develop professionally, foster leadership skills, and excel academically. SASE National Convention

The SASE National Convention & STEM Career Fair is SASE's grandest annual event. National Convention is the largest conference for AAPI individuals in the United States with **over 1400 attendees** at the 2023 National Convention with students from **103 different universities** across North America. Professional development opportunities are available to SASE members at the National Conference like leadership workshops and networking with company representatives/peers at career fairs. The 2024 National Convention will be hosted in Boston, MA from October 10th to 12th.

SASE Southeast Regional Conference

The Southeast Regional Conference is hosted annually by one of the **16 SASE chapters** in the Southeast region of the United States. In the past six years, USF SASE hosted this event in **2018**, **2020**, and **2022**. This conference serves as an opportunity for students from SASE chapters all over the South Region to build themselves professionally through networking opportunities with companies, workshops, and more. When SERC was held at USF in **2022**, we had **200+ attendees** from **15+ universities** and **10 sponsors**. We are proud to be hosting **SERC 2025 at the USF Tampa Campus**, and strive to reach a larger number of students, while providing more networking opportunities with company sponsors.



DIVERSITY & SOCIALS

USF SASE holds many social events throughout the academic year to celebrate our cultures and recognize important concepts and matters, like mental health or academic support. Some noteworthy events are the Mid-Autumn Festival Event (Fall 2023) with 106 attendees and Speed Friending with SASE (Fall 2023) with 79 attendees, which are traditional events that we regularly host. We hold an End of Year banquet at the end of the academic year to celebrate our members' accomplishments. We had a record-breaking attendance of 101 attendees to our 2024 End-of-Year Banquet! We are hosting a Mid-autumn banquet this fall, which aims to have 300+ attendance, and our sports tournaments during spring. On top of SASE events, our organization continues to table at other events such as Journey to the East (a collaboration with all the Asian clubs at USF) and Bull Market.

























SERVICE & VOLUNTEERING

This year we worked with eight different organizations to volunteer for the unhoused, shelter animals, polluted beaches, and more conjunction with our biweekly causes. In Botanical Gardens volunteering program, our numerous larger service events ensured that we had volunteer events at least once a week if not twice a week. We ensured that our service opportunities were spread far and wide, totaling over 80 volunteer hours from USF students. USF SASE provided excellent diverse opportunities by collaborating with organizations like USF Botanical Gardens, Humane Society's animal shelter, Feeding Tampa Bay's Trinity Cafe, and more.

OUR PROGRAMS

SASE Interns Program

This is to ensure the succeeding generation of the SASE Executive Board is familiar with traditions, role responsibilities, and resources available to E-board officers. The program trains each intern towards a specific position over the course of a semester through the completion of position-specific training. Through this program and training, SASE builds on interns' leadership qualities and event planning skills while juggling role-specific tasks and responsibilities.





SASE Biq-Little Program

Our intra-university Mentorship Program pairs mentors and mentees to build skills, knowledge, and friendship. This mentorship covers professional, academic, and social guidance to strengthen our member's backgrounds and profiles.





SASE Alumni Program

All SASE members are welcome to join this professional mentorship program. Each SASE member that joins will be a mentee paired with a professional mentor that guides their mentee via one-on-one meetings, insight into their position/field in the industry, and serve as a general guide in professional matters. We invite any former SASE members or anyone who wishes to take part as a mentor from your companies to be a part of this program.

HACKATHONS: We support and connect teams of students with all of the resources they need to be successful in popular hackathons, along with gaining professional connections and technical experience.



PAYMENT METHOD

Method A (through USF Foundations): This form of payment is through the primary donor website used to donate money to specific causes at USF. This method is tax-exempt as it is through a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization.
